Hebrews 11:23-27 Choosing

1 Peter 5:8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:

Philippians 2:12-13 ...work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure.

Matthew 13:44 The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field. 45 Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. 46When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it.

Luke 9:24 For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will save it.

Isaiah 53:4 (NASB) However, it was our sicknesses that He Himself bore, and our pains that He carried; Yet we ourselves assumed that He had been afflicted, struck down by God, and humiliated.

Philippians 1:29 For to you it has been granted on behalf of Christ, not only to believe in Him, but also to suffer for His sake,

Acts 3:22 / Deuteronomy 18:15 For Moses truly said to the fathers, 'The Lord your God will raise up for you a Prophet like me from your brethren. Him you shall hear in all things, whatever He says to you.

Some connections between Jesus & Moses

- Both had rulers that tried to kill them as babies (Exodus 1; Matthew 2)
- Both connections with Egypt (Exodus 2:1–4; Matthew 2:13–14).
- Both sent out 12 men (Numbers 13; Luke 9:1-6)
- Both have a connection to the law.
 - Moses wrote down the law (Deuteronomy 31:9)
 - o Jesus Christ fulfilled the law (Matthew 5:17)
- Both were deliverers, sent by God (Exodus 3; Matthew 1:21)
- Moses leads the first Passover, Jesus is the Passover lamb
 - o Exodus 12; 1 Corinthians 5:7

1 John 4:20 If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen.

- 2 Corinthians 4:18 So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.
- 1 Corinthians 1:18 "the message of the cross is foolishness, to those whose who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God"
- 1 Corinthians 1:23 but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles,
- 1 Corinthians 2:14 The natural man does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God. For they are foolishness to him, and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually discerned.
